Re: October 30, 2017 GRAMA Request

Mr. Cromar;

My office received your request for records on October 30, 2017, the request asks for all public records/communications regarding golf play; including but not limited to tee times, player names and including but not limited to free, traded, or paid play on whatever means, including but not limited to so-called PAR 9 software used from CH golf course opening through December 2014, stored within city office and/or through PAR 9 software creators offices or wherever located. Also, if these records have been destroyed please provide date of destruction, who authorized the destruction, and who performed the destruction.

The city changed the golf course reservation software system (PAR 9) in December of 2014; at that time PAR 9 removed the software which contained the golf reservation records. The city attempted to contact PAR 9 in an effort to obtain the records you are requesting and has found out that PAR 9 is no longer in business, therefore the records you are requesting are no longer available to us.

Any person aggrieved by a governmental entity's access determination may appeal the determination within 30 days to the chief administrative officer of the governmental entity by filing a notice of appeal. The city's current chief administrative officer is Chandler Goodwin, the City Manager/Planner. The notice of appeal shall contain the following information: the petitioner's name, mailing address, and daytime telephone number; and the relief sought, and the petitioner may file a short statement of facts, reasons, and legal authority in support of the appeal.
