Utah Legal Tender Act

The **Utah Legal Tender Act**, which was passed March 10, 2011, recognizes gold and silver coins issued by the United States^[1] as <u>legal tender</u> in the state of <u>Utah</u>.^[2] This includes allowing the state of Utah to pay off debts in gold and silver and allowing individuals to transact in gold and silver coins without paying state <u>capital</u> gains tax,^[3] among other provisions.^[4] The bill was introduced as HB317 by State Representative Brad J. Galvez.^[5]

In 2020, <u>KSL-TV</u> in <u>Salt Lake City</u>, <u>Utah</u> reported 25-50% of small business in Utah were accepting independently produced <u>Goldback</u> currency which had been created in the aftermath of the 2011 law.^[6]
